

Water Service Interruption Worksheet

Water interruptions can happen at any time. When they do, the best strategy is to have a plan in place. Please consider consulting your team members and answer the following questions:

Menu

- What items can be offered safely with no water or the alternate source of water?

Alternate Safe Water Sources

- What are alternate sources of water that can be used in a water interruption?
- What equipment is needed to obtain alternate safe potable water?
- Who to contact to secure safe potable water? (*Hint: Consider a supplier of bottled water, licensed drinking water hauler, and/or licensed ice supplier as well as places where public drinking water can be put into cleaned and sanitized potable water containers*)

Inventory

What supplies are needed to manage a water interruption?

- Equipment/containers to store water received from water hauler
- Bottled water
- Disposable utensils and single use items
